Election Season is Here!

It is time for our KCCA members to take part in the election of two new members to our Board of Directors. The Nominating Committee has interviewed candidates and put forward three names. You will see their bios in this Newsletter. You will also see their information posted in our buildings and it will be online at YesElections.

Please mark your calendar for the May 11th Meet the Candidates Event hosted by Community Conversations. This will be held in the banquet room from 1-3.

Voting opens on May13th at 9:00am, PT. Your ballot should arrive in the mail around that date. We can't control mail delivery. When you have your ballot, and it is May 13th or later, you may go online to vote, or fill out your ballot anytime and mail it back to YesElections. We recommend that you mail it back as soon as possible.

Important Candidate & Voting Deadlines

- May 6: Final date for resident-members to turn in petitions to KCCA Office for candidacy. These names will not be on the ballot. These members will campaign as write-ins. All candidates may participate in the Meet the Candidates Event on May 11.
- May 10: YesElections mails ballots to all resident-members.
- **May 11:** Meet the Candidates Event, hosted by Community Conversations.
- May 13: Voting begins at 9 a.m. PT for electronic voting. YesElections Help Desk opens to help with ballots if you are away from home or have questions. The KCCA Office won't be able to help with this. Beginning May 13th you may call YesElections at 866- 384-9978 or email them at help+KCCA@veselections.com.
- June 1: Members Annual Meeting
- June 2: If you haven't mailed your ballot yet, this is the last day for members to drop off paper ballots at the KCCA Clubhouse to insure timely delivery to YesElections. These ballots will be mailed via Fed/Ex overnight on June 3.
- June 6: Online voting closes at 2 p.m. PT.
- **June 10:** On or before this date, YesElections provides results to Committee Chairs. Candidates will be notified of the results. Election Chairs will post results at the Clubhouse, Library and Crown Center. The Office will eblast results and post them to our Website.
- June 11: New Board installed.
- June 13: Election signs down.

following information has been submitted by Rev. Clara Z. Alexander, who facilitates the group.

Three women created the KCCA club called Drumming for Peace in May of 2023. Meeting on the 3rd Wednesday of every month, we've become a group who enjoy being together. We beat Native American drums and other drums (whose names I do not know), ring brass bowls, or shake rattles or sticks. We have a variety of soundmakers and extra drums. One person brings a rattle made from

dried beans in a milk cardboard carton (maybe Almond milk), and another beats on white buckets. Our aim is to shake up stagnant

energy in ourselves and our communities. We drum and meditate for 5 to 10 minutes in spontaneous quiet times. Sometimes, our meditation is drumming for peace in diversity or for those who have recently passed to the next life. We value and include those who can keep a rhythm as well as those who can't. We support each other in remembering the feeling of joy and peace within our hearts.

I just might grab my rain stick or brass bowl and join in the drumming on the 15th as part of my continuing challenge that we all get out there and try something new each month.

That was followed by a detour into a 15-year career in journalism, culminating in a stint as editor of the Forest Grove News-Times.

He went back to school in the mid-1980s to earn a master's in teaching degree at Pacific University and finally got started as a teacher and basketball coach, joyous work he continued until retiring in 2014.

Lono and Gayle moved to King City in 2016, where he has served as president of the Shuffleboard Club, co-founder of the Table Tennis Group, co-founder and director of the King City Deep Stack Texas Hold em Tournament, and publisher of an electronic newsletter focused on the governance of our HOA called the King City Observer. He was appointed to the KCCA Board of Directors earlier this year.

What has surprised him the most about King City since moving here? "This is the first time I have lived among so many fellow Vietnam veterans, and I had no idea what I was missing on that front until I got here."

Tolls

Hello, King City Friends and Neighbors! May flowers are blooming, and the Primary Election for 2024 is here. Be a mindful citizen and vote. We will discuss the results of the Primary Election at our meeting on May 16, the 3rd Thursday of the month.

Tolls in Oregon are not "dead," as some Oregonians may believe. John Ley will be our main speaker, explaining Oregon Governor Tina Kotek's recent decisions and statements. Governor Kotek is allowing tolls with the I-5 Interstate Bridge Replacement program, and she has asked the Oregon Legislature to consider a major transportation package in the 2025 session. Funding for HB 2017 projects from 7 years ago has an estimated shortfall of \$3 billion.

Washington County residents need to keep a watchful eye on ODOT and their Westside Mobility Improvement Study (WMIS). That package of projects includes unspecified tens

of billions in costs and a proposal to fund them, in part with tolls. Plans also include connecting Hwy 26 with US 30 to bypass the Vista Ridge Tunnel in downtown Portland and a new MAX light rail tunnel under the Willamette River connecting downtown Portland with Lloyd Center.

Governor Kotek has been silent on tolling recently because of the uproar it has caused and does not want to let tolling have a negative impact on the November election. Tolling around the Portland Metro Area will affect all residents. Come and join John Ley for the most accurate and current information about tolling in Oregon.

There will be updated information for School Choice. Petitions will be available for your signatures, and packets will be available for those who can help gather signatures.


