



Strength in readiness, safety in preparation

Wildfire Smoke

The biggest health threat from smoke comes from microscopic particles that can get into your eyes and respiratory system. Exposure to smoke from large fires can cause burning/itching eyes, a sore throat, cough, shortness of breath, wheezing, sinus headaches, nasal discharge and can seriously aggravate chronic heart and lung conditions.

Use an N95 mask to protect yourself from smoke inhalation. The “95” refers to the percentage of particles filtered out by the mask. Dust masks and bandanas are insufficient for smoke.

Limit your exposure to smoke by doing the following:

- If you are not ordered to evacuate your area, but smoky

conditions exist, close all doors and windows and stay indoors at home. However, if you do not have air conditioning and it is too warm to stay inside with the windows closed, seek relief elsewhere, such as a community clubhouse, library, shopping mall, or an alternate shelter.

- Your HVAC system (furnace, A/C, heat pump), with high-efficiency filters, can help. If your system has fresh air intake, set the system to “recirculate” mode and close the unit from outdoor air intake.
- Consider a portable air cleaner in one room of your home and spend time in the lower pollution level.
- Avoid using anything that burns: wood fireplaces, gas logs, gas stoves, and even candles. Don't vacuum, as that stirs up small

particles in your home. Don't smoke.

- In your car, keep windows up and set your a/c to recirculating mode.
- Stay alert to emergency notifications on TV or radio for information and instructions from local authorities.
- Talk in advance to family/friends to develop a plan with options of where you could evacuate if needed and do so immediately if authorities so order.



made improvements to the shop and assisted in outside projects throughout our community, such as Rebuilding the Gazebo, Men’s and women’s Locker room doors, Building and repairing wood signs for buildings and other handy work. Though this amenity is not a Club per se, we do assist other fellow

woodworkers in our projects—help is only there by asking.

The only requirement to enjoy this amenity is the ability to pass a simple Safety Test (verbal, not

written), which involves going over the safety and how to use the equipment in the shop. The dues are \$50/year, which we use to keep the equipment in tip-top shape. Each member is given a pair of safety eyewear to use, assigned a locker (to store their personal hand tools/projects) and gain keyless access to the shop (using your white Amenity Card). Access to the Woodshop is from 6 a.m. to midnight; access is limited for use after midnight for safety and security concerns.



Golf Items from the Handicap Chair

I field questions almost every day on Handicapping, Rules and Tournaments procedures. I will try to answer these questions here as well as I can.

Many players do not understand the PCC (Playing Conditions Calculation).

What is the PCC?

The playing conditions calculation (PCC) determines whether playing conditions on the day differed from normal conditions to the extent that an adjustment is needed to compensate. It is a daily statistical procedure that compares the

scores submitted by players on the day against expected scoring patterns.

Since scores are required to be posted on a daily basis, scores not posted on that day will not be used to calculate the PCC.

The question has arisen: What happens if a score is posted after that date? Does it get the PCC adjustment?

Q: The playing conditions calculation (PCC) resulted in an adjustment of +2 on May 1, 2024, for the XYZ Course. A player posted his score on May 5, but the date played was recorded as May 1. Will the +2 PCC adjustments be used to calculate the player's

Score Differential for that day?

A: Yes. While the player's score wasn't in the original data pool on the day of play, scores that are backdated on a day where a PCC was triggered will also have the adjustment applied to their differential. Look for the adjustment denoted in your scoring details display.

NOTE: A plus PCC adjustment means the course played harder than normal, while a negative PCC adjustment means the course played easier than normal on that day.

For the monthly results, I refer our readers to the new TAB on our website, Men's Golf.


