Tai Chi has gained recognition for its physical and mental health benefits. When considering its potential impact on individuals with mild dementia, the practice of Tai Chi offers a promising avenue for improving their overall well-being. A study published in the Annals of Internal Medicine (6 Nov. 2023) indicated that seniors enrolled in Tai Chi classes showed improved performance on memory tests, especially if they took a more challenging form of the exercise. The slow, deliberate movements of Tai Chi promote balance, flexibility, and calmness, which are particularly beneficial for individuals experiencing mild cognitive impairment. Engaging in Tai Chi enhances cognitive function, providing a sense of mental clarity and focus. The social aspect of practicing Tai Chi in a group setting fosters a sense of community and support, which is crucial for individuals living with dementia. Numerous studies indicate the beneficial effects of Tai Chi on the bodies and minds of those who engage in this gentle practice. William Fuller, martial arts instructor, leads classes in Tien Tai Chi on Wednesday and Friday from 10:00 to 11:00 in the Club House ballroom. All are welcome.







Let's keep KCCA vibrant and maintain our community's curb appeal. How? There is definitely a method to LARC "madness." LARC rules and requirements were established years ago and are included in the Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions (C C & Rs) to which we adhere.

WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF ARCHITECTURAL AND LANDSCAPING GUIDELINES?

- Maintaining property values:
 Uniformity in architectural design and landscaping can contribute to higher property values.
- Enhancing community
 aesthetics: Well-maintained
 homes and landscapes can
 create a more aesthetically
 pleasing environment for
 residents.
- Creating a cohesive community: HOA guidelines help ensure that the community has a consistent look and feel.

LANDSCAPING TIPS:

Preparation is crucial for successful landscaping projects:

Soil Enrichment:

- Conduct a soil test to determine nutrient levels and pH balance, then amend the soil as needed with organic matter such as compost or aged manure.
- Consider mulching garden beds to help retain moisture, suppress weeds, and gradually enrich the soil as the mulch breaks down.

Pruning and Trimming:

- Examine trees and shrubs for damaged or diseased branches and remove them to maintain plant health and minimize the risk of pest infestation or disease transfer.
- Trim hedges and ornamental plants to maintain their beauty and neat appearance.

Weed Control:

- Apply pre-emergent herbicides to prevent weed seeds from germinating, followed by regular inspections and hand-weeding to remove any existing weeds.
- Consider implementing landscaping fabric or organic mulches to smother weeds and minimize their growth throughout the season.

Lawn Care:

- Aerating the soil can improve air circulation, water infiltration, and nutrient absorption for healthier grass growth.
- Overseeding bare or thin patches with appropriate grass seed varieties can help achieve a lush, uniform lawn.
- Adjust mower blades to the recommended height for the specific grass type, ensuring optimal cutting without stressing the turf.

Planting and Transplanting:

- Choose native or climateappropriate plants to minimize water usage and maintenance while supporting local biodiversity.
- Plan landscaping projects by

- considering sun exposure, soil moisture, and mature plant size for successful growth.
- Water newly planted or transplanted vegetation deeply and consistently to encourage root development and minimize transplant shock, especially during dry spells.
- Please check the King City Street Trees list for approved trees.
