Our KCCA July 4th Parade Grand Marshall!!

Joyce Saari, a longtime resident of KCCA, will be this year's July 4th parade Grand Marshall — a choice that reflects both her vibrant

spirit and lifelong commitment to community. At 99 years young, Joyce's life is a remarkable tapestry of community service, creativity and resilience. A master gardener, artist, and active volunteer, there couldn't be a more fitting choice.

Joyce was born in 1926. She and her brother were raised in Portland, Oregon, supported by 13 aunts and uncles. Her brother was later killed while in the service. She attended Kennedy Elementary, Commerce High School (now Cleveland High) and Hastings Business College, where she studied shorthand to fulfill her dream of being a legal secretary.

After graduation, Joyce worked in a law firm on the 15th floor of the Northwestern National Bank Building. Outside of work, Joyce enjoyed war bond rallies and the big band era's music. She loved to dance (especially the jitterbug), sing, and even sang

> with Portland-born actress Jane Powell at one of the rallies.

In 1947, Joyce met Al Piland at a dance at Blue Lake Park. They married and had two children. After their separation 19 years later, she raised her children as a single mother. In 1972, she married Del Hewitt, a

trucker, pilot and inventor of truck improvements like the air-operated window lift. Together and with several others, the Pacific Northwest Truck Museum was founded in Brooks, Oregon.

Due to her diminutive stature, she was unable to see out of the window to fly Del's plane. So she went to "ground school" to learn to navigate while Del was flying. Del and Joyce lived in Aurora, Oregon, on 20 acres where Joyce honed her gardening skills by landscaping the 20 acres on her own. She remained married to Del until he died in 2005.

She moved to King City in 2006 and later married Arnie Saari, with whom she was active in the Lions Club. After his passing, she continued her service as a devoted Lions member.

Joyce has also been a member of lota Delta Sorority since 1966, where she launched a successful plant sale fundraiser benefiting local causes. This effort earned her the moniker "plant lady."

Joyce Saari is a shining example of resilience, service, and joyfulness. KCCA is honored to celebrate her as this year's Grand Marshal — a woman whose legacy continues to inspire.



Golf Handicap Explained

The Handicap Index (HI) is difficult for many players to understand in the golf world. It is the starting number used to determine the Course Handicap for the player on a particular course and set of tees.

Handicap Index (HI) - This is your "raw" calculated number, taken to one decimal point, and is based on the average of your lowest Score Differentials. You never actually play with this number, but it is displayed on your record and is the basis for your Course Handicap.

How is the Handicap Index calculated? You average the eight best differentials of the last 20 scores posted.

What is a score differential? It is 113 divided by the slope rating of the course played times (the adjusted gross score minus the Course rating minus any PCC adjustment).

Now let's look at some other perplexing terms.

Low Handicap Index - The player's lowest Handicap Index over the last 365 days is also shown on your record with an effective date. This value is tracked and compared to your regular index daily at midnight and used in the WHS capping procedure to set a soft or hard cap.

Course Handicap - This is a value expressed as a whole number, and is your index converted to the specific set of tees being played. You can easily find your CH by tapping on the GHIN mobile app 'Handicap Calculator' or by looking up your Course Handicap on the sheet in the proshop.

Playing Handicap - The Course Handicap adjusted for any handicap allowances due to the format of the game played. It represents the actual number of strokes the player gives or receives for the event being played.

Soft and Hard Cap:

A *soft-capped index* is applied when a player's calculated index is 3 points greater than the lowest computed index (LCI) in the past 365 days. The result is an index that rises at a 50% rate rather than the normal rate if the player posts higher scores and/or greater differentials.

A *hard capped index* is applied when a player's calculated index is 5 points greater than the lowest computed index (LCI) in the past 365 days. The result is an index frozen at that level until either the player improves or the LCI changes as the days increase.


