The non-golfer will be required to adhere to all other course policies and not play golf. Therefore, we will continue to monitor that each golfer has their own set of clubs. If you happen to see multiple people playing out of one bag, please contact the Pro Shop. Non-golfers are not to play while on the course. We thank you all for your assistance in monitoring items of concern on the golf course. We encourage residents to NOT confront individuals on the golf course with issues.

KC Music August Program: Movie Music!

During these hot summer days, many of us seek out the air conditioning in movie theaters, along with the entertainment of the film. Have you ever really focused on how music enhances the experience?

Our August program will feature music from the movies. Our chorus is working on *As Time Goes By* from *Casablanca*, *Dancing Queen* from the Fred Astaire favorite, *Top Hat*, *Rainbow Connection* from *The Muppet Movie* and *The Days of Wine and Roses* from the movie of the same name.

This month will see the return of some of your favorites: **Gene Park** with that fantastic tenor voice, **Judith Lynne** with some jazz styling that always puts a smile on everyone's face and **Chick and the Chicklets** might even put in an appearance.

Let's take a deeper dive into how movie music got so important. The early movies were silent films with an organist keeping the audience connected with the film with emotional/exciting playing. By the 1920s, "the talkies" emerged due to technological advancements that enabled the recording of sound with film. The 1920s marked the birth of an era of orchestral movie scoring. Some of the notable composers of that time included Max Steiner, Eric Konold, and Alfred Newman.

In the early days of music scoring, the piano was widely used. Once the initial vision for the music was established, it transitioned to orchestra arrangements to enhance the emotional impact of the scene, character, and film.

In the 1960s, the electronic age entered movie music. This allowed for a whole new sound that could signify futuristic concepts, such as robots, aliens, and Time Machines. Then came synthesizers, and the changes continued to come! Music is a universal language; it stimulates brain activity, especially the parts of the brain that process emotions and memory. There's so much more to explore to learn about how music enhances those movies. But, for now, we hope you will join us for our program highlighting music from the movies.

The museum features a lovely gift shop, along with a beautiful working carousel. Each traveler will get two

tickets to ride on the carousel.

After the tour, we will go for a no-host lunch at "The Brick & Mortar Cafe" in Albany.

We will start signing in and loading onto the bus at 9:30. The bus will depart for Albany at 10:00 and is expected to return to King City around 4:00.

Golf Course Rules are changing in the following manner:

- Pets of any kind are not allowed on the golf course at any time. Certified ADA service animals are permitted, but they must adhere to strict ADA guidelines.
- Any golf cart for use on the golf course must pay a daily or annual cart trail fee prior to use on the course. Any riding golf cart must be specifically designed for golf

course use and be of traditional golf cart size. Private

golf carts must adhere to posted cart requirements.

- Golfers are to play only one ball per hole, as outlined in the Rules of Golf. Playing multiple balls for practice purposes during a round is prohibited. The course is intended for play, not for practice or use as a driving range.
- A ride or walk along will be permitted. Check with the Pro Shop.

How about a rules Quiz?

A player's ball comes to rest on a sprinkler head, which he is entitled to the nearest point of relief for the drop. After selecting the drop area, he drops from the knee height but the balls first hits his club and comes to rest in the relief area. Does the drop count?

Answer: Rule 14.3b(2)
