LARC Luminations

Welcome to the latest edition of LARC Luminations! Our goal is to communicate the Landscape and Architecture Review Committee's (LARC) purpose and goals. We will also provide periodic updates and helpful tips.

LARC Basics: The LARC Committee is charged with the review of construction and modification of properties - e.g., house painting, roof replacements/ renovations, solar panels, sheds, fences, etc. LARC is also tasked with ensuring properties remain tidy and safe - shrubs trimmed to provide clear views for emergency personnel and easily navigable sidewalks and curbs.

Did you know? Safety is a priority for LARC. Our focus is on walkways that are clear of debris,



overgrown shrubs, weeds, and moss. With residents having balance or mobility issues, we want to ensure they, too, may safely enjoy a walk around our neighborhood.

May I install solar panels? For projects requiring approval, consult the CC&Rs and Resolutions - mykcca. com and complete a LARC Project Request form. Some projects require both KCCA and King City approvals, i.e., additions, fencing, tree removal; please include a copy of your permit or a statement from the city that a permit isn't needed with your application.

I saw a sidewalk with overgrown weeds. Who do I notify?

Complete a LARC Complaint form from the website or pick one up at the KCCA Office and give the form to the staff. Remember to include your contact information (you'll remain anonymous) and as much information for the other party. This also extends to issues with stray pets or noise.

Info you need to know: If you've noticed new signs posted on the streets, the city's expanding Ride



Connection's schedule and stops. See the bulletin board at the Clubhouse for more details.

Fall Tip: Ensure your yard lamps, air filters, and smoke alarm batteries get changed so you're ready for fall!

Asking for a neighbor who can no longer maintain their lawn - is help available? LARC is putting together a resource list of volunteer groups who will be available to assist homeowners. Please contact LARC if you know of a group (scout troops, church youth groups, service clubs, etc.) willing to serve. We hope to have this information available in the next few months. 
2026 Budget to be presented to Community Residents

The KCCA Budget & Finance Committee has been meeting several times a week to prepare KCCA's budget for 2026. In doing so, the committee has evaluated our year-to-date 2025 expenses, projecting them against the 2025 budget and identifying budget items for 2026.

The committee recognizes the importance of sharing the proposed 2026 budget with residents, solicit their input, and, if appropriate, amend the proposed budget prior to submission to and approval by the KCCA Board of Directors. Residents are asked to review the following schedule and provide their input to the 2026 budget.

October 14, 2025 - A draft 2026 budget will be presented to the KCCA Board of Directors. Following the presentation, a copy of the draft budget will be

The Month of October

October is considered a great time of year to take a road trip, and much of that reputation can be traced to fall foliage.

Leaves begin to change color in many regions in early October, and the resulting colorful landscape is beautiful to behold. Though some may presume the shift in color in October is due to the month's typical drop in temperature, it's actually due to a decrease in sunlight.

According to the Farmer's Almanac, leaves begin to lose their green color when photosynthesis from sunlight slows down, which happens because the hours of daylight dwindle considerably



during the month of October. That lack of sunlight causes chlorophyll to break down, which in turn causes leaves to change color.

But not all leaves will look the same, as any leaf-peeping pro will know. Some leaves turn red, while others turn brown, orange or yellow. The trees that turn red get more direct sunlight in October, while those that get less direct sunlight turn brown, orange or yellow.







Can you believe that this is the

month of Halloween? Spooky! Where did the Summer go? It felt like the heat would be here forever.

Last month, a small group of us went on a field trip to Red Ridge Farm in Dayton, and it was so much fun. This place has a winery, but we were there to hear about their other product... olives.

Reservations had been made for the guided tour at 11 a.m., but we wanted to get there about an hour before that started, so we could

> do some plant shopping since we had heard that there was a nursery there too (and boy, did we shop!).

> With our purchases safely packed in the bus, we started the hour-long

tour. It was so informative to hear about how olives are harvested and the oil is processed. Robin (our guide) even threw in a little history of the farm and how it has expanded over the years.

After this lovely tour ended, we were offered a sampling of the different olive oils, and it was incredible to taste the differences in each oil.

After the tasting, we set out for lunch at J's Family Restaurant in Newberg. The food there was good, the conversation was good... and we left for the trip back home, talking all the way about the sights, sounds and smells we had experienced.



KC Chorus October Program: Richard, Oscar and Jerome!

Who are Richard, Oscar and Jerome? Some of the greatest music writers and lyricists of musicals for stage and television! Our chorus is going to bring some of their music to you in our next program. Many folks know of the collaboration of Rodgers and Hammerstein, which produced such musicals as "Oklahoma," "South Pacific," "The King and I," and "Cinderella." Rodgers and Hammerstein wrote eleven musicals together. Less seems to be known of Jerome Kern (1885 -1945), who changed the trajectory of the "American" Musical with innovations like 4/4 dance rhythms, using syncopation and jazz progressions. He wrote over 700 songs, including the musical "Showboat," containing "OI' Man River" and "Can't Help Loving that Man." Hammerstein wrote of Jerome Kern in his edit of songs. the Jerome Kern Songbook: "Jerry was a worker who would never stop polishing until he was satisfied that a melody had reached its destined and perfect shape. The high standards of his own exceptional taste were applied to every note he wrote."

Our program will include

"Long Ago (and Far Away)," 1944, lyrics by Ira Gershwin and music by Jerome Kern for the musical "Cover Girl" starring Gene Kelly and Rita Hayworth. Our second Jerome song is "A Fine Romance," with lyrics by Dorothy Fields and music by Kern, featured in the 1936 musical "Swing Time," starring Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers.

The Rodgers and
Hammerstein selections
include "Ten Minutes Ago,"
from Cinderella, written
in 1957 for television and
performed on stage a year
later in 1958. Hammerstein
wrote both the book and
the lyrics for the songs. This
was the only work done by
the pair for television.

"Shall We Dance?" from
"The King and I" premiered
on Broadway in 1951
and won a Tony for Best
Musical. It became a
musical film in 1956, with
Richard Rodgers writing
the music and Oscar
Hammerstein writing the
script and lyrics for the
songs.

The History of Pumpkin Carving



Pumpkin carving, now a staple of Halloween celebrations, has roots stretching back centuries. The tradition originates from an Irish myth about a man nicknamed "Stingy Jack." According to legend, Jack tricked the Devil several times and was denied entry into both heaven and hell after his death. Condemned to wander the earth, Jack carried a hollowed-out turnip with a burning coal inside to light his way. People in Ireland and Scotland began carving scary faces into turnips. beets, and potatoes, placing candles inside to ward off Jack and other wandering spirits. These early lanterns became known as

Jack-o'-lanterns.

When Irish immigrants came to America in the 19th century, they discovered that pumpkins—native to North America—were larger, easier to carve, and more plentiful than turnips. Pumpkins quickly became the new canvas for this folk custom. By the late 1800s, pumpkin carving had blended with Halloween festivities in the United States, which were already evolving into more community-oriented celebrations.

The association between pumpkins and autumn also helped the practice spread. Pumpkins were tied to harvest time and Thanksgiving, making them a natural fit for October traditions. As Halloween shifted from a solemn night of warding off spirits to a more playful holiday centered on children, costumes, and parties, pumpkin carving transformed as well. Instead of frightening faces alone, people began experimenting with decorative patterns and fun designs.


By the 20th century, pumpkin carving kits, stencils, and

contests popularized the activity even further. Communities held carving competitions, and families adopted it as an annual tradition. Today, pumpkin carving is both an art form and a cultural ritual. From simple triangle-eyed Jack-o'-lanterns to intricate portraits etched into pumpkin skin, the craft has become a creative outlet as much as a Halloween symbol.

Despite its evolution, pumpkin carving still reflects its origins: the flickering lantern meant to guide or scare away spirits on a dark autumn night. What began as a Celtic folk belief has grown into one of the most recognized and beloved parts of Halloween, uniting history, creativity, and community in the glow of a carved pumpkin.


